Our School Growth Plan focuses on structured literacy, math and French oral language competencies. We recognize that the COVID experience has been challenging and we aim to address this. In the classroom and through professional development, we are strengthening our approach to reading acquisition in both languages, following a systematic and sequential approach to reading and spelling, increasing decodable texts in both English and French and reviewing practices in every grade. We have a strong history of proactive reading intervention, which will continue. A new French math program, Mathology will be in most of the classrooms and we will continue to support staff with the implementation of the best practices in second language acquisition.

Our **Communicating Student Learning Plan** aims to ensure both parents and students are involved in the assessment and reporting process. Our plan includes: frequent, specific and descriptive feedback, a snap-shot of learning checklist (Oct.), teacher-led and student-led conferences (Nov. and March respectively), portfolios (May) and two report cards (Dec.and June). We want parents and guardians to know what their child is learning, how they are progressing and where they are going in their learning. The parking lot is ONE WAY - you may enter the lot off of 4th Avenue and Exit on 3d only.

#### Parents, we need your assistance!

The office gets many last minutes calls each day requesting that a child be ready, dressed and in the office for a specific time for an appointment. This is very challenging for the office staff to manage with 480+ students in the building. We ask that parents let teachers know of any appointments in advance, but to also arrive early enough to help get your child ready for the appointment. Come into the office and we will direct you to the classroom. Thank you for your support.

We are aware that we live in an era of immediate communication - texts, cell phones, emails. Please know that teachers spend most of their day teaching; they cannot answer texts or calls until breaks in the day and emails are often answered at the end of each day. Please be patient and ask your child's classroom teacher the best way to get ahold of them and when to expect a reply.

#### ÉWES School Council:

The school council meets on the third Monday of every month at the school. Everyone is welcome. This years' school council, Laura Lang, Sarah Gallina, Donna-Marie Haughton, Ron Davis, Alisha McLean, and Johanna Havelaar, wishes everyone a great school year.



Covid is unfortunately still circulating. We do not have mask requirements this year; however, we continue to ask you to be vigilant, keep sick students at home. If your child still has symptoms but no fever and feels like returning to school, please provide a mask to keep others safe. Thank you for your continued support.

#### First Day at School is on Tuesday, August 22nd at 8:25.

Kindergarten students have a staggered entry from August 22 - 24 with the first full day of classes on August 25th. Welcome.

Students will be asked to line up at the bell. School starts at 8:25 and dismissal is at 3:07. A table will be set up to help students find their classes if they don't already know. Classroom letters were sent out this past week and class supply lists are available from the office.

**Front Lawn:** Grades 4/5, 5s, 6s, and 7s line up behind the appropriate cone on the front lawn. These classes will be met by their teachers and enter through the front doors.

**Soccer Field:** Grades 1, 2, 3, and 4 will line up on the soccer fields at their class tag attached to the fence (a cone will be placed for easy visibility on the first day). Teachers will help students find the right line up.

Kindergarten students will enter with their parents to the appropriate classes during the staggered entry.

#### Dismissal:

**Bus students** will line up behind their cone on the soccer field. We ask students to line up and stay in line until we sort out bus arrival order and other routines. When students are familiar with bus routines, students on later buses will be permitted to play. Please make sure the bus tag is attached to the bag.

**Primary Students** for pick up - kindergarten and grade 1 students will line up by the fishy fence for parent pick up; let teachers know about daycare pick up and arrange with the daycare for a pick up location at the end of the day (share this with the classroom teacher).

Always remind your child of your after school plans. If you have a tricky schedule that changes frequently, luggage tags with interchangeable, different coloured cards will help, tie a different ribbon for each different house, (blue for one house, grey for another) or write the days of the week on each bus tag (ex. Bus 20 Monday, Thursday and bus 35 Tuesday, Wednesday, Friday). Please share your system with your child's classroom teacher. It is tricky getting everyone to the right spot at the end of everyday and your help is appreciated.



Our snack and lunch programs are not yet up and running. Please be sure to pack a nutritious snack (or two), lunch and send along a water bottle. Remember - no nuts (ground or tree nuts).
