Communicating Student Progress

Written Progress Reports were sent home on December 9th. This report communicates students' progress in most subjects to December. The teachers' comments focused on French/English Language Arts and Mathematics. In some instances, you may find a comment that suggests that due to absences your child's progress was not assessed in a particular subject. If your child was away due to illness or other reasons, they may have missed a unit, series of lessons or maybe missed the final assessment in that unit. Without evidence of learning (a completed assignment, quiz, test or presentation), the teachers were unable to assign a performance indicator. Your child has more time to complete units or demonstrate their learning in the coming months. In the term comments, teachers made observations about your child's learning, areas of strengths and stretches and next steps.

If you have concerns, please contact your classroom teacher about your child's progress report.
